Arlington Woman's Club Scout Project and Award

Boy Scout Carl Barrett of Arlington will be awarded the Eagle Scout rank at an Eagle Court of Honor ceremony on June 3, 2017. He is in 11th grade at Wakefield High School. Carl joined scouting as a Cub Scout when he was in first grade, and has performed many hours of community service as part of the Scouting program including Scouting for Food. However, one of his earliest scouting service

projects was helping the Woman's Club of Arlington with the annual paper shredding event at the request of Pat Fisher. So, it was providence when in 2016 Pat Fisher asked the Troop 648 Scoutmaster about creating terraces and removing invasive ivy at the Woman's Club of Arlington as a potential Eagle Project. Carl was looking for a community project to earn his Eagle Scout rank. After much planning and help coordinating the project with Kathleen Harrison and Sandy Newton, the work was conducted on November 11, 2016. There were more than 25 Scouts and Wakefield High School students removing ivy and building the terraces. The combined hours of service for the project totaled over 187 hours. Carl finished the project, then earned the last few required merit badges by March 2017, and had his Eagle Board of Review in April. The Eagle Court of Honor ceremony awarding Carl the rank of Eagle Scout will be held at 1:00 PM Saturday, June 3, 2017 at Arlington Forest United Methodist Church, 4701 Arlington Blvd, Arlington, VA 22203.
